NS Ref.	What is the problem?	Where is it?	What are we doing about it?
715	Anti-Social Behaviour / Youth Congregation / Flytipping / Fires	Hadrian's Way	The <a href="#">Neighbourhood Response Team</a> have removed fencing and cut back shrubs and bushes to improve sight lines, patrol the area daily removing graffiti, drug dens and dealing with vandalism. We also feed all appropriate information into Street Wardens and the Police.
716	Flytipping	Walker Road	The Neighbourhood Environmental Action Team (NEAT) remove instances of <a href="#">flytipping</a> as they occur. Wherever possible, we will identify the source of the fly-tipped items and report the incident to <a href="#">Public Health and Environmental Protection</a> who will take the appropriate legal action. There has been a big improvement in fly-tipping of commercial waste following the a resent arrest by Public Health and Environmental Protection.
779	Maintenance of neighbourhoods during demolition	McCutcheons Court Walker Road Cambrian Estate	The <a href="#">Neighbourhood Environmental Action Team</a> will manage these areas during the transitional period. We will seed the soiled areas and fence off to prevent fly-tipping etc
898	Street Lighting	Monkchester Recreation Ground	Funding has been awarded from the Safe Neighbourhoods initiative to install an additional 2 lighting columns on Monkchester Recreation Ground to illuminate the area around the Community Centre and Nursery.
922	Traffic Management & Parking Problems	St Vincent's School - Monkchester Road	The <a href="#">Ward Coordinator</a> is currently liaising with St Vincent's School to identify ways in which we can make the area outside the school safer for children and also look at the current problems in terms of parking at pick up and drop off times. Possible schemes include barriers outside of the school gates and introducing road markings.
938	Involving local people in the decision making process	Ward Wide	The Neighbourhood Response Manager and Ward Coordinator are currently involved in participatory budgeting with every Residents Group in the ward. Using the Environmental Forum as a delivery mechanism for possible ideas and solutions to problems, we have identified 5 environmental improvements local people would like to see introduced at various locations throughout the ward. We have subsequently sent out 6000 leaflets asking local people to vote on the scheme's that they would like to see go ahead and also put forward any ideas and suggestions. The response so far has been extremely positive and once the 3 most popular schemes have been identified, we will award £10,000 to the scheme with the highest number of votes, £2000 and £1000 respectively to second and third placed schemes. The <a href="#">Environmental Ward Stewardship</a> will fund the schemes and we will also consider the possibility of partnership funding to assist in the cost of larger schemes.
